
## The BIG BANG FAIR

As part of Science week 2019, we took 100 students from Y9 and Y10 to the Big Bang Fair in Birmingham. The students behaved impeccably and really embraced the variety of workshops and exhibits on offer to them at the event. Students were able to explore how Science and Engineering are used within a variety of careers. The interactive explosions, engineering demonstrations and hands on Biohazard exhibitions allowed students to get practically involved. The real life Drones, Red arrow plane, Tractors, the Army Air Corps' Gazelle and Shell Eco-marathon car were all perfect photo opportunities!

There were hundreds of schools present, with over 80,000 due attend across the 4 day event, our students were a pleasure to take and a credit to Winterhill School.

## READING WEEK

We have had yet another successful and enthusiastic reading week this month, which included the annual World Book Day tradition. Staff delivered 'high standards' during the annual dress up as their favourite character from a book. This encouraged engaging conversations amongst staff and students, raising awareness for the variety of literature and promoting a live long love of reading.



## CAREERS WEEK

During this academic year, we have been able to inspire and encourage our students to think about their future pathways ready for when they leave school by giving them access to a range of careers and higher education workshops and talks through our partnership with heppSY+. This has included a range of activities including time on the HeppSY+ bus looking at higher education, a motivational speaker and 1:1 careers interviews.

Monday, 4th March saw the beginning of careers week and students have been able to access a range of careers related activities. This has included a Future First workshop where two of our alumni supported some of our Y9 students looking at career progression whilst inspiring them with their own stories and through PSHCE students have accessed a virtual careers' fayre looking specifically at apprenticeship opportunities. To celebrate World Maths Day on Wednesday, 6th March, heppSY+ ran workshops for over 200 of our students across Y9 and Y10 which focused on careers in maths.

Feedback from students has been very positive and we will continue to create more opportunities in the future.
