A POSITIVE START to LEARNING

In September, all students moved to smaller tutor groups of around 15 students. This has allowed us to dedicate vital time to our students' wellbeing and also explore important topics in society and within our school community. Within their new tutor groups, students have made an incredibly positive start which they can all be very proud of. GOOGLE CLASSROOM

As you will be aware, any students who are required to self-isolate can access their learning via Google Classroom, this includes all lesson resources, assessments and feedback from their subject teachers. To support with time management, we recommend that students access their Google Classroom as they would their usual timetable. As well as home learning, all homework is set via Google Classroom. Again, students can access all homework resources and also submit directly to their teachers via their classroom.

CATCH-UP CURRICULUM

Staff in school have been investing a lot of time in developing the school curriculum so that, over the coming months, students are able to return to topics missed during lockdown. This approach, along with thorough assessments, will allow students to catch up and keep up with their studies. Via Google classroom we will also provide bespoke support packages of interventions for those students who need them. Interventions will predominately be aimed at English and Maths and will begin for targeted students in all years after half term.

The WEARING of FACE COVERINGS in SCHOOL

As you will be aware, as of Saturday, 24th October 2020, Rotherham has been designated Tier 3 restrictions and alert level 'very high'.
